Wood Badge

is advanced training in group leadership skills for volunteers involved in all levels of Boy Scouting (Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Venturing, Exploring, district, or council positions).

Wood Badge consists of two parts. The first part is a two-weekend experience, living with a group of Scouters in an outdoor environment.

During this time, participants are trained in leadership skills in order to better serve those units with which they are involved. Through this living/working experience, each person develops knowledge and understanding of these skills. This team-development model is in widespread use in corporate leadership training and will be an invaluable tool in all aspects of your Scouting, business, and personal life.

During the second part—after the outdoor experience—participants work on commitments made during the two weekends. A maximum of 18 months may be used to finish these goals in order to fully complete the course. Each person will be evaluated on their performance. Upon successful completion of Wood Badge, Scouters receive their beads of recognition and become members of Troop One, Gilwell.

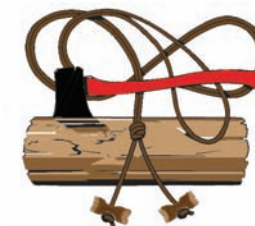

You are invited to experience the ultimate in Scout leadership training. Originally organized by Lord Robert Baden-Powell, Wood Badge is designed to offer Scouters the opportunity to learn leadership skills in an outdoor environment. Through living and working the Scouting program, you develop knowledge and understanding of the skills you need to help you be successful in the development of yourself and youth.

How to Qualify

You can participate in this exciting two-weekend training course if you:

- Are currently registered as an adult Scouter in a Cub Scout, Boy Scout, or Venturing unit, or if you hold a district- or council-level position.
- Whether you have attended Wood Badge in the past or not.
- Are at least 21 years old (except Assistant Scoutmasters who may be 18).
- Have completed Youth Protection Training and training specific to your Scouting position.
- Submit a completed application and pay the total fee prior to July 31, 2009.

Location

The Wood Badge course will be held at both Camp



Masonite Navarro in Redwood Empire Council and Camp Tamarancho in Marin Council.

Dates

Wood Badge is a two-weekend course scheduled as follows:

Friday, September 25
through Sunday, September 27 *and*

Saturday, October 10
through Monday, October 12

Participants *must* be on site (in uniform) and ready to begin *no later than* 8:30 a.m. on Friday, September 25 and 8:00 a.m., Saturday, October 10. Arrangements can be made to spend the night previous to the start of each weekend.



Cost

Fee for the course is \$220. This covers training materials, food, and equipment for the entire course as well as a course shirt and hat. The only equipment you will need is your personal camping gear, tent, and clothing. A detailed list will be provided.

A \$75 deposit will hold your place. Your deposit will be refunded if you are unable to attend. *If unable to attend, you must notify Piedmont Council in writing before July 31, 2009.* Refunds will also be made if the course is filled before your registration is received.
