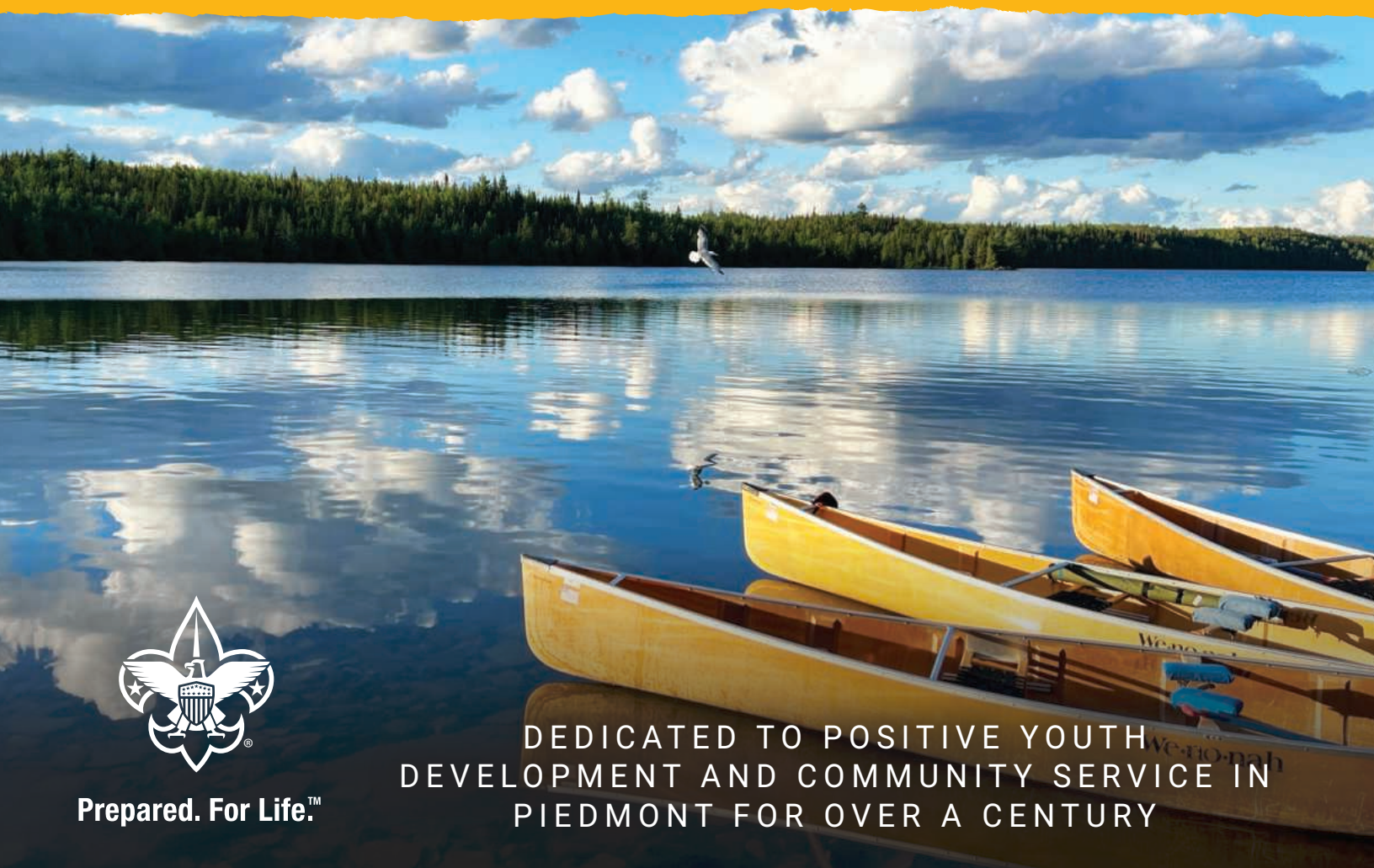

Youth in Scouts BSA attended camps ranging from Catalina Island to the northern coast of Oregon. They enjoyed giant canoes, horseback riding, climbing, games at the campsite, the chance to earn merit badges, and so much more.

22 Eagle Scouts earned the rank of Eagle, including our council's first ever female Eagle Scout.

These Eagle Scouts led teams of youth and adults through projects totaling **3,210 service hours** to the community.

Many projects focused on rebuilding or repurposing an area. They include restoration of the Firestorm Memorial Garden, building a shelter at the beginning of a trail, and refurbishing bikes to be given to youth in need. These scouts embody the principals of leading others in service to the community.

Outside of Eagle projects, Scouts BSA troops helped clean Kirby Cove and Sausal Creek, assisted with the Turkey Trot and other local events, and supported camps in and out of Scouting.

Reported service hours totaled **1,795 hours**.

Piedmont Community Service Crew is well known for their annual house renovation project done in collaboration with Rebuilding Together Oakland: this is a crew-funded, youth-planned and executed project that takes months of planning. During 2022, the crew also spent many days helping to renovate the CityTeam building in downtown Oakland, donated countless hours planning and cooking food, built a few "tiny bathroom/showers" for a homeless village, and built several beautiful redwood planter boxes for Clausen House and Altenheim Senior Living. All together, the Venturers of PCSC contributed **1,631 service hours** to the community.

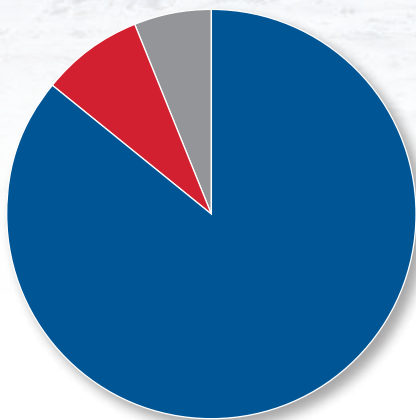

- Administration (6%)

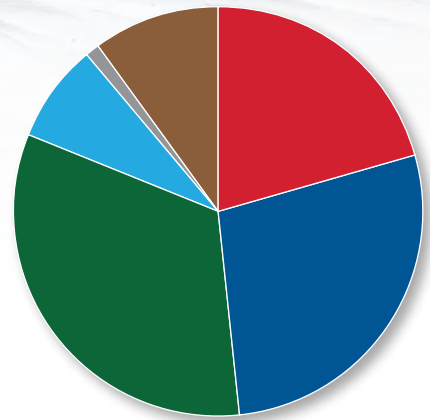


Total Expenses \$595,332
