DESCRIPTION OF AWARDS

SILVER BEAVER – This award is presented to adult volunteers for exceptional Sservice to youth by registered Scouters, upon recommendation of the local council, and approval of the Executive Board of the National Council, Boy Scouts of America. In 1926, the first Silver Beaver was presented to Lord Baden Powell. Since that time the Piedmont Council has presented this honor to 106 people.

Each year the Piedmont Council is privileged to honor an individual with this coveted award. Because of the number of Scouters who are deserving of recognition, the selection of each year's recipient is a difficult task. We are appreciative of all our Scouters who make the Scouting programs possible for hundreds of Cub Scouts, Scouts, Venturers and Explorers.

AWARD OF MERIT – The Award of Merit is presented by Council to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level. The nominee must be a registered Scouter and have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside of Scouting, or both.

WILLIAM R. PETERSON AWARD FOR LEADERSHIP BY YOUTH – This award was established in 1999 to honor William R. Peterson, a lifelong Scouter. This award is to recognize Piedmont Council youth, who through their leadership, demonstrate the benefits of being a youth run organization.

SIDNEY C. SINGER SERVICE TO YOUTH AWARD – This award was established in 1986 in honor of longtime Scouter, Sidney C. Singer, Jr. The award goes to a citizen of Piedmont who has performed outstanding service to youth in the community, either in or outside of the Scouting program.

NESA OUTSTANDING EAGLE SCOUT - (NOESA) was established during the BSA's 100th Anniversary in 2010 with the first recipient to receive the award a year later. The award was created to recognize notable Eagle Scouts who had either performed distinguished service at the local, state, or regional level or who were known nationally, but had not yet met the 25-year tenure as an Eagle for the Distinguished Eagle Scout Award.

DISTINGUISHED SCOUTER – This award was established in 1985 by the Piedmont Council. The award is presented to a person within a Cub, Scout, Venture, Explorer or Learning for Life unit that has given outstanding service to their unit within the past year. Selection is made by unit leadership or their designees.

Wood Badge is the premier training experience for all adult volunteers, and is open to registered Scouters who desire to develop and improve their interpersonal communication and leadership skills to better serve in Scouting and other areas of their lives. It consists of five days spread over two weekend sessions, and is hands-on learning in group experiences held in an outdoor setting. This is followed by a period of up to 18 months in which each participant works to achieve their five unique goals developed during the course training.

The first Wood Badge training was organized by Francis "Skipper" Gidney and lectured by Lord Robert Baden-Powell and others at Gilwell Park in the United Kingdom in September 1919. Wood Badge training has since

spread across the world with international variations. Upon completion of this training, you will join thousands of other leaders around the world who are dedicating themselves to passing on the ideals of Scouting. Virtually everyone who completes Wood Badge training feels that the course is well worth the commitment of time and energy as a participant, with positive results across many areas of their lives.
